

Solid Waste Disposal at the Transfer Stations



Household garbage - Kitchen and table food waste, packaging, clothing, etc.

White goods - Washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, hot water heaters, etc.

Metal - Tin roofing, shelving, bicycles, fencing, lawn mowers, etc. Note: Must be free of gas and oil.

Used Oil - Each household may bring in 5 gallons per month. If you have more, please call Jeff Howley at 754-4906.

Used Sharps (Syringes and lancets) - The resident must place their used sharps in the biomedical waste container at the facility.

Tires - Up to 8 car tires per year per household. Excessive loads (over 8 tires) must go to the Northwest Solid Waste & Recycling Facility.

Fluorescent Lamps - Up to, but not exceeding four feet in length.

Lead Acid Batteries - Car, boat, motorcycle, and small truck batteries.

Nickel/Cadmium and Lithium Batteries - Rechargeable types - power tools, cell phones.

Latex Paint - Limited quantities of paint will be allowed to be dropped off at no charge to the residents.

Recyclable Materials Accepted at the Transfer Stations



Cardboard - All types

Newspapers and paper bags

Plastics #1 & #2 - Milk, water, soda, and detergent bottles.

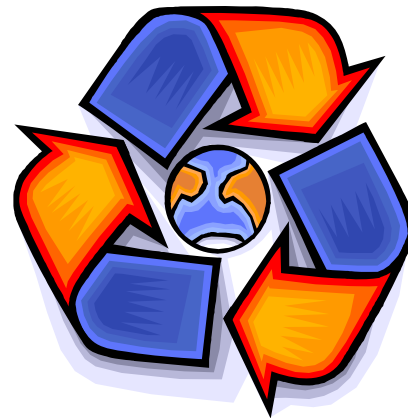
Aluminum cans

Steel cans

Glass Bottles (Clear, Green, and Brown)

Mixed paper - Office paper, junk mail, magazines, telephone books

Scrap metal



Solid Waste Assessment

Only debris coming from assessed residential property, transported by the resident, will be accepted at the transfer stations. Excessive amounts of debris must go to the Northwest Facility and may be subject to extra disposal fees. Vacant lots and businesses are not assessed for solid waste disposal; therefore, that debris **MUST** go to the Northwest Solid Waste & Recycling Facility to be weighed and charged for disposal.

Residential Barcode ID Tags Issued

Tags are issued to residents that are assessed for solid waste disposal.

Trailers and Oversized Vehicles

No oversized vehicles (dump trucks, moving vans, etc.) are permitted. Trailers larger than 5' wide or 10' in length (including the frame and tongue) and 2' in height are **NOT** permitted. All oversize vehicles and trailers must use the Northwest Solid Waste & Recycling Facility.
